## Collective Worship Take Home

In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how the 8<sup>th</sup> of June is World Oceans Day, a time when people around the world think about how to care for seas, oceans and the creatures living in them. Dutch inventor, Boyan Slat, first became worried about ocean pollution as a teenager after seeing huge amounts of plastic while diving. He created the organisation The Ocean Cleanup, which designs special systems to remove rubbish from oceans and stop more plastic entering rivers and seas.



Things you could talk about at home:

### **WONDER** (Looking out at the world)

- Why do you think God created oceans and rivers, and why are they important for people and animals?

### **REFLECT** (Looking inwards at ourselves)

- Have you ever seen litter or pollution near a beach, river or park? How did it make you feel as someone who wants to care for God's creation?

### **DO** (Responding through actions and choices)

- What small changes could you and your family make to help protect God's oceans and the creatures that live in them?

## Year 5 and Year 6 residential to Mount Cook



From Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> to Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June, our Year 5 and 6 pupils enjoyed an unforgettable residential visit to the Mount Cook Adventure Centre, set on the edge of the Peak District. This not-for-profit outdoor centre is renowned for providing exciting, confidence-building experiences that encourage teamwork, resilience and independence.

After arriving on Wednesday, pupils quickly got stuck into their first round of activities including archery, orienteering and the "Game of Tribes." Over the three days, they took part in a range of adventurous challenges such as rock climbing, abseiling and canoeing, all designed to develop teamwork, resilience and problem-solving skills. Evenings were equally memorable, with guided walks and campfire bushcraft sessions where pupils learned outdoor survival skills and spent time reflecting on their shared experiences.

Throughout the trip, the children showed increasing confidence, independence and determination, supporting one another every step of the way. Residential experiences like this are invaluable in helping pupils grow socially and emotionally, as well as strengthening friendships.

By Friday, pupils returned home tired but full of pride and wonderful memories. We are incredibly proud of how they represented the school and I would like to personally thank Mr Ferwerda, Mrs Reason and the Mount Cook team for making the trip such a success.
