In Collective Worship this week, we have been thinking about how between the 2nd and 6th of September, more than 100 of the world's best cyclists competed in the Tour of Britain for Men. The five-day race began in Lincoln and travelled through Lincolnshire and Yorkshire, before finishing in the Scottish Borders on 6th September. In the men's event, the cyclists cover nearly 900 kilometres, tackling steep hills and challenging conditions along the way. Thousands gathered along the route to watch and cheer the riders on.

WONDER (Looking out at the world)

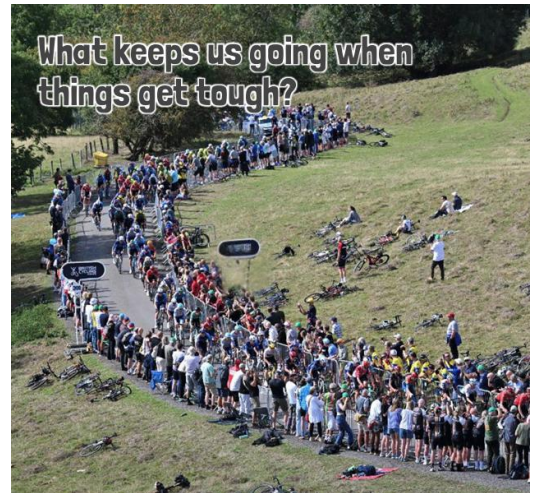
- I wonder who helps and encourages others to persevere through challenges.
